Madhya Pradesh : Assembly Hall

- The building of Madhya Pradesh Legislaive Assembly is located in Bhopal (Area Hills). Earlier, meetings were held in Minto Hall in 1909. The Minto Hall was built by Shah Jahan Begum.
- The Construction work of new assembly hall began on 14 September 1984. It was inaugurated by the then President Dr. Shankardayal Sharma on 03 August 1996.
- This building was named as Indira Gandhi Legislative Assembly, where architect was Charles Correa.
- At the entrance of the assembly, a huge painting named Jeevan Vriksha has been painted, in which the historical sites of the state have been displayed and the structure of the Kund is engraved on its main entrance. The walls of the entrance have been painted by the famous painter Jangarh Singh Shyam.
- This new Assembly building has also received the world famous Aga Khan Award in the field of architecture.

There is a special provision in Madhya Pradesh for the appointment of a Tribal Welfare Minster by the Governor on the advice of the Chief Minister.

Judiciary in Madhya Pradesh

- Prior to the formation of Madhya Pradesh as a state, the court of Madhya Pradesh was established at Nagpur on 2 January, 1936 under section 108 of the Indian Government Act, 1935. The High Court seat was shifted to Jabalpur in the year 1956.
- The main building of Madhya Pradesh High Court was constructed under • King Gokuldas in 1889. The architect of the building was Henry Irwin.
- Madhya Pradesh High Court was established at Jabalpur and two benches • were set up at Indore and Gwalior on November 28, 1968 and the third bench is under proposal to be established at Bhopal. The total number of

judges in the Madhya Pradesh High Court is 36, while it has a sanctioned strength of 53 judges.

High court : Specific Facts

- The first Chief Justice of the Madhya Pradesh High Court was Justice M. Hidayatullah, who was honored to be the 11th Chief Justice of the Supreme Court (First Muslim Chief Justice).
- The first lady judge of the Madhya Pradesh High Court was Mrs. Sarojini Saxena.
- The incumbent Chief Justice of Madhya Pradesh High Court is Mohammad Rafiq. Vandana Kasrekar (died recently undergoing Corona treatment), Nandita Dubey, Anjuli Palo – Women Judges of Madhya Pradesh High Court in the recent time.

District courts

- Revenue Court Revenue Court has been established at Gwalior district for Revenue related Civil cases.
- In 2011, after the amendment in Madhya Pradesh Land Revenue Code, 1959, all the rights of revenue monitoring and hearing were granted tos this court.
- Fast Track Court Fast track courts were established on April 1, 2001, on the recommendation of the 11th Finance Commission to expedite the disposal of criminal cases. A total of 85 fast track courts are established at the state.
- Labour and Family Court In the State of Madhya Pradesh, family courts have been set up in all divisional headquarters, while 25 Labour Courts have been setup under the Industrial Act, 1960.

Police Training Academies in Madhya Pradesh

Jawaharlal Nehru Police Academy

- This academy was established in the form of Police Training School in the year 1906 at the fort (1660 AD) built by King Udan Shah in the Sagar district.
- In 1936, it was given the status of Police Training College and the status was upgraded to Police Training Academy in 1986.
- Training is provided to the selected candidates for the posts of Sub-Inspector and State Police Services at this institute.

Rustamji Armed Police Training College

• It was established in the year 1980 at the Indore district.

- In the year 1988, it was granted status of college and in the memory of the Inspector General of Police Shri K.F. Rustam, it was named as Rustamji Arshant Police College in the year 2003.
- Training is provided at this institute to the selected candidates for the posts of the Sub-Inspector, Platoon Commander and State Police Services.

Madhya Pradesh Police Academy

• It was established on 10th June, 2013 at Bhopal (Bhari). In this institute the training is provided to the selected candidates for the posts of the Sub-Inspector and the State Police Services.

- The First Inspector General of Police of Madhya Pradesh was VG Ghate (1956-1958).
- The First lady IPS-Kumari of Madhya Pradesh was Asha Gopalan.
- The Madhya Pradesh Crime Bureau was formed in the year **1983**, with its headquarter at **Bhopal**.
- The first metro police station of Madhya Pradesh is located at Habibganj (Bhopal).

- The first open cellular jail in the state was established in the year **1973** at **Mungaoli** (Ashoknagar).
- Regional Jail Management Research Institute is located at Bhopal.
- Jhiri village in Betul of Madhya Pradesh has been declared as 100% crime free village.
- The first ISO certified police station of the state is Dewas.
- Madhya Pradesh Police Memorial Day is celebrated on 21st October.
- In Madhya Pradesh, **yoga education** has been made compulsory for prisoners since **1955**.
- The first forensic lab in Madhya Pradesh was established at the Sagar district. Additionally, other forensic laboratories are operational in Bhopal, Gwalior and Indore.
- The first Cyber Forensic Lab of Madhya Pradesh was established at Bhopal.
- Headquarter of Madhya Pradesh Cyber Police is located at Bhopal.
- In Madhya Pradesh, the headquarter of the **Central Bureau of Investigation** (CBI) was established at **Bhopal** in the year **1960**.
- Madhya Pradesh Police Band School is situated in Bhopal.
- Narcotics branches are being set up in Madhya Pradesh at Indore, Mandsaur and Neemuch districts.
- The Madhya Pradesh government has decided to establish an Integrated Police Training Centre at village Bhouri neae Bhopal.
- Madhya Pradesh is the first state in India, where the **first Dial 100 service** was launched in year **2015**.
- In Madhya Pradesh 36th Battalion of Madhya Pradesh Special Armed Forces is constituted for the Naxal-affected areas and internal security on August 04, 2015 in Balaghat.
- The third eggcell of India and first egg cell of Madhya Pradesh has been set up in Bhopal Jail. (Egg Cell high security compound inside a person).

State Election Commission

- Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission was constituted on January 19, 1994 under Article 243K (3) for free and friar election process in the state.
- Its Chairman is appointed by the Governor.

Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission : Specific Facts

- Madhya Pradesh was the first state to constitute State Election Commission.
- The first notification for the election of Panchayat was issued by Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission on **April 15, 1994.**
- The first President of the Madhya Pradesh State Election Commission was Mr. NB Lohani and the current President is **Basant Pratap Singh.**

Madhya Pradesh Human Rights Commission

- The Madhya Pradesh Human Rights Commission was constituted on September 13, 1995 by the State Government through the powers conferred by section 41 (1) of the Human Rights Protection Act, 1993. The Chairman and the members of this Commission are appointed by the Governor.
- Current Chairman is Justice Narendra Kumar Jain.

Advocate General of MP

- The Governor of each State appoints a person who is qualified to be appointed as a Judge of a High Court, as an Advocate General for the State. The post has been created by the Constitution of India and corresponds to that of Attorney General of India at the union level.
- The Advocate General is the top-most legal officer of the state, who is appointed by the Governor. According to Article 177, the Advocate General is not a member of the Legislative Assembly, but can participate in the assembly meetings and discussions.
- The Advocate-General holds the office during the pleasure of the Governor, hence his tenure is not fixed. He received remuneration as the Governor may determine. He can resign any time by giving resignation letter to the Governor.
- The first Advocate General of Madhya Pradesh was Mr. M. Adhikari while the current Advocate General is Mr. Purushendra Kaurav.

Madhya Pradesh SC, ST Commission

• The Madhya Pradesh Scheduled Caste and Schedule Tribe Commission were formed by the Act of 1995. Presently, the Chairman of Madhya Pradesh Scheduled Castes Commission is Anand Ahirwar and the Chairman of Madhya Pradesh Scheduled Tribe Commission is Narendra Maravi.

MP Backward Classes Commission

 The Madhya Pradesh Backward Classes Commission was constituted on 13th March, 1993 for implementing welfare schemes for backward classes by the Madhya Pradesh government. The present Chairman of Madhya Pradesh State Backward Classes Commission is J.P. Dhanobia.

Director of Backward Classes Welfare was formed on 12 October, 1982. On 12 September, Department of Backward Classes and Minorities welfare was formed by the Madhya Pradesh Government.

State Minority Commission

• This commission was formed on October 23, 1996 under the State Minorities Act, 1996. Presently the Chairman of this Commission is Niaz Muhammad Khan.

Madhya Pradesh Waqf Board

• Under the Waqf Act, 1995, this board was formed in the year 1996 for the Maintenance, control and administration of all the Waqf properties in the State. Its current Chairman is Gufran Azam.

State Information Commission

• Under Section 15 of the Right to Information Act 2005, the State Information Commission was constituted on August 22, 2005. Its current Commissioner is Arvind Kuman Shukla.

State Women Commission

 For the purpose of empowering women in the state and as an urgent action on the atrocities and crimes against women, the State Women Commission was constituted on 23rd March, 1999 under section 3 of Madhya Pradesh State Women's Commission Act, 1995. Its current Chairperson Mrs. Shobha Oza.

Madhya Pradesh Public Services Guarantee Act

Madhya Pradesh is the 1st state in India to passed the Public Service Guarantee Act in 2010, is the first state in India to pass this act. Its aim is to establish good governance through Citizen Service Delivery System. Through Madhya Pradesh Public Service Guarantee Act, 302 services have been notified under 30 departments.

Accountant General

• In the Madhya Pradesh, the office of Accountants General was established at Gwalior in 1985 for auditing of various departments and organizations of the State and Central Government. It has its branch office at Bhopal headed by Deputy Accountant General. From October 1, 2004, the office in Bhopal is known as office of Accountant General and the office at Gwalior is known as office of Principal Accountant General.

State Economic Offence Investigation Bureau

• The State Economic Offenses Investigation Bureau was constituted at Police Headquarter Bhopal on 20th November 1976, to investigate economic offence, communal and disruptive activities in the state.

State Administrative Tribunal

- State Administrative Tribunal was constituted under the Article 323, of the Constitution at Jabalpur in 1985, to resolve disputes arising from appointment and service recruitment to the public services and posts of the state.
- Currently, the other benches of the State Administrative Tribunal are located at Bhopal, Gwalior and Indore.

Madhya Pradesh Lokayukta

- The Lokayukta organization was constituted for the first time in 1981, based on the proposal of Narsinghrao Dixit Committee on 20 June, 1969. It was constituted for appointing Lokayukta to resolve the citizen grievances against the administration.
- The main function of Lakayukta organization is to check abuse of power by civil servants which leads to harassment, malpractices, maladministration and corruption.

Madhya Pradesh Lokayukta : Specific Facts

- The first Lokayukta of Madhya Pradesh was Purushottom Vinayak Dixit.
- The first Up-Lokayukta was of Madhya Pradesh was RJ Bhave.
- The current, Lokayukta of Madhya Pradesh is Justice NK Gupta, Vice-Lokayukta is Justice Umesh Chandra Maheshwari and Judicial Member is Justice SK Palo.
- The tenure of Lakayukta or Up-Lokayukta is of 6 years.

Madhya Pradesh state Vigilance Commission

- Madhya Pradesh State Vigilance Commission was established on 01 March, 1964. The main members of this body are Chief Vigilance Commissioner and Vigilance Commissioner.
- Vigilance officers are also appointed at Division and District Level.

Madhya Pradesh Public Service Commission

- Madhya Pradesh Public Service Commission was constituted on 27 October 1956, under Section 118(3) of the States Reorganization Act by the order of the President.
- Chairman and members of this commission are appointed by the Governor on the advice of State Council of Ministers. Its headquarters is located at Indore.

MPPSC : Facts

- Madhya Pradesh Public Service Commission conducted its first exam in 1958.
- The first Chairman of Madhya Pradesh Public service Commission was DV Rege (ICS).
- The current chairman of Madhya Pradesh Public Service Commission is Prof. Rajesh Lal Mehra.

RCVP Noronha Academy of Administration and Management

- It was established at Bhopal in 1966 as Lal Bahadur Shastri Institute of Public Administration. It was renamed as Madhya Pradesh Administrative Academy in 1975 and later in 2001 it was renamed as RCVP Noronha Academy of Administration and Management in the memory of Ronald Carlton Vivian Piadade Noronha, ICS, who served as Chief Secretary of the state for almost 10 years.
- At this academy training is provided to the selected officers in the State Administrative Service and other services. Chief Secretary level officers are appointed as the Director General of the Academy.

Madhya Pradesh State Planning Commission

 Madhya Pradesh State Planning Board was constituted on 24th October, 1972 and it was renamed as State Planning Commission on September 21, 2007.

- The Chairman of this Commission is the Chief Minister and The Deputy Chairman is State Planning Minister and Chief Secretary of State Government is the ex-officio Secretary of the commission.
- Additionally, the commission consists of 6 members, 15 advisers, 12 assistant advisers and 12 sub-advisers.

State Finance Commission

- After the 73rd and 74th constitutional amendment, under Article 243 (A) a provision for establishment of a Finance Commission has been made to review the financial status of Panchayat every 5 years.
- The first Finance Commission in Madhya Pradesh was constituted on June 14, 1994, and its first Chairman was Mr. Sawai Singh. The current president of the commission is Mr. Himmat Kothari.

District Planning Committee

- In Madhya Pradesh, provisions related to constitution of District Planning Committee in every district have been made under Article 243ZD by the 74th Constitutional Amendment, 1992.
- In these committees, 80 percent members of Panchayat Raj institutions and urban bodies of the district are included.
- The District Planning Committee Act was passed in 1995, in order to strengthen the position of District Planning Committees.

Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Training for Youth in Leadership & Rural Development

 Sanjay Gandhi Institute of Training for Youth in Leadership and Rural Development was established at Pachmarhi In Hoshangabad district on 14th December, 1980 by Madhya Pradesh Panchayat and Rural Development Department, with an aim of providing training related to rural development to the talented youth cadre and rural development-oriented organizations.
